Dear Praying Friends,

Many times I find believers expressing the notion that a Jewish person who is secular or observant in merely a limited fashion are easier to witness to. I typically find this a false assumption. I most often find the more observant or religious Jewish person can be a better prospect because have some understanding of Messiah, where the more secular Jewish person tends to have little understanding and even less concern for Messiah. This was once again confirmed to me in a written response from one such Jewish women who had received our tract in Houston. To quote her she says, "I am not interested in, nor do I believe anything about a so-called Messiah!" She went on to say that she was under the impression that only non-Jewish people believe in the Messiah. This lady is 71 years of age and despite having been raised by "2 wholesome Jewish parents" it is painfully clear that she not only does not understand historic Judaism but she lacks understanding of the Hebrew Scriptures. Please pray for this lady that the Holy Spirit will do His work in her heart and draw her to Messiah.

When I read such a response it always tends to tear at my heart! It is a stark reminder of how difficult the ministry God has called me to truly is. I grieve with the Apostle Paul for the desperate straights of my people and desperately long to see them come to faith! It is not possible to hide behind an often misused and misquoted verse claiming that since the vail is on their hearts they are a hopeless cause. 2 Corinthians 3:15 does say "But even unto this day, when Moses is read, the vail is upon their heart." However, you cannot stop reading there and hide behind this verse justifying not witnessing to Jewish people nor supporting Jewish Missions! God didn't stop there and verse 16 declares "Nevertheless when it (that heart) shall turn to the Lord, the vail shall be taken away." Verse 15 helps me appreciate why our ministry is so very difficult but it is verse 16 that keeps me driving forward! So, for 26 years we have been reaching out to Jewish people, plowing the ground, planting and watering the seed and begging God that it will take root, that their heart will turn to the Lord and the vail taken away! Please continue to keep our outreach in your prayers and continue to keep these Jewish souls we reach to in your prayers!
